together with her mother emmeline christabel pankhurst co led the single sex women s social and political union wspu founded in 1903 and soon regarded as the most notorious of the groupings campaigning for the parliamentary vote for women a first class honours graduate in law the determined and charismatic christabel a captivating orator revitalised the women s suffrage campaign by rousing thousands of women to become suffragettes as wspu members were called and to demand rather than ask politely for their democratic citizenship rights a supreme tactician her advocacy of militant unladylike tactics shocked many people and the political

establishment when an end to militancy was called on the outbreak of war in 1914 she encouraged women to engage in war work as a way to win their enfranchisement four years later when enfranchisement was granted to certain categories of women aged thirty and over she stood unsuccessfully for election to parliament as a member of the women s party in 1940 she moved to the usa with her adopted daughter and had a successful career there as a second adventist preacher and writer however she is mainly remembered for being the driving force behind the militant wing of the women s suffrage movement this full length biography the first for forty years draws upon feminist approaches to biography writing to place her within a network of supportive female friendships it is based upon an unrivalled range of previously untapped primary sources

first published in 1987 this collection brings together important articles written by emmeline pankhurst and her daughters during the suffragette campaign 1903 14 includes a transcript of the 1908 trial of the suffragette leaders their speeches and major pamphlets of the women's social and political union

the twelve essays collected in this work explore the afterlives of nineteenth and twentieth century writers in biographical fiction or biofiction and its sister genre the biopic the essays situate these genres in relation to their generic cultural and ideological contexts

and are organised into four groups the first locates the origins of biofiction in the historical novel and in modernist experiments in life writing while the second consists of case studies of biofiction about writers from the long nineteenth century charlotte brontë henry james constance fenimore woolson and rupert brooke a guest essay by novelist maggie gee opens the third group which analyses the fertile sub genre of biographical novels about woolf while the fourth and final part of the book concerns the related genre of the biopic the volume is comprised entirely of original commissions whose authors include postgraduate students practitioners and specialists in biographical writing it will appeal to undergraduates and postgraduates on life writing and contemporary literature modules as well as fans of the featured biographical novelists and their subjects

she also exerted a singular influence on american popular culture challenging rigid assumptions about how women should behave and almost single handedly gave them permission to wear pants the list of adjectives used to describe hepburn bold stubborn witty beautiful only begin to hint at the complex woman who entranced audiences around the world she could also be controlling selfish and self righteous so here is the full epic story of the patron saint of the independent american female as one critic described her from her breakthrough in hollywood in the early 1930s to on golden pond in the 1980s to her dramatic affairs with howard hughes and spencer tracy and beyond with her distinctive patrician voice and tsunami force personality hepburn always lived life strictly on her own terms and oh what a life it was

the final volume of the new perspectives in edward albee studies series expands the analyses of edward albee s theatre beyond anglophone countries ranging from academic essays performance reviews and interviews the selected contributions examine different socio political contexts cultural dynamics linguistic communities and aesthetic traditions from the 1960s to our contemporary days albee abroad gladly brings together varied voices from czech republic people s republic of china brazil iran germany spain and greece thus enriching albee scholarship with more plural tones

delmer daves 1904 1977 was an american screenwriter director and producer known for his dramas and western adventures most notably broken arrow and 3 10 to yuma despite the popularity of his films there has been little serious examination of daves s work

filmmaker bertrand tavernier has called daves the most forgotten of american directors and to date no scholarly monograph has focused on his work in the films of delmer daves visions of progress in mid twentieth century america author douglas horlock contends that the director s work warrants sustained scholarly attention examining all of daves s films as well as his screenplays scripts that were not filmed and personal papers horlock argues that daves was a serious distinctive and enlightened filmmaker whose work confronts the general conservatism of hollywood in the mid twentieth century horlock considers daves s films through the lenses of political and social values race and civil rights and gender and sexuality ultimately horlock suggests that daves s work through its examination of bigotry and irrational fear and depiction of institutional and personal morality and freedom presents a consistent innovative and progressive vision of america

the stage lives of animals examines what it might mean to make theatre beyond the human in this stunning collection of essays una chaudhuri engages with the alternative modes of thinking feeling and making art offered by animals and animality bringing insights from theatre practice and theory to animal studies as well as exploring what animal studies can bring to the study of theatre and performance as our planet lives through what scientists call the sixth extinction and we become ever more aware of our relationships to other species chaudhuri takes a highly original look at the animal imagination of well known plays performances and creative projects including works by caryl churchill rachel rosenthal marina zurkow edward albee tennesee williams eugene ionesco covering over a decade of explorations a wide range of writers and many urgent topics this volume demonstrates that an interspecies imagination deeply structures modern western drama

this collection of essays seeks to present articles that examine the early ventures of the 1960s and 1970s in the progressive theatre of identity with a new contemporary view considering the intersection of race gender ethnicity economic class and sexual orientation in 1964 edward albee and his producers richard barr and clinton wilder produced funnyhouse of a negro by adrienne kennedy and dutchman by amiri baraka then leroi jones and by 1968 had produced the seminal gay drama the boys in the band by mart crowley no

other major american playwright of this period including thornton wilder arthur miller tennessee williams or william inge produced the plays of their junior colleagues with a specific focus on difference and diversity for most scholars these productions and albee s involvement in them are a somewhat obscure footnote in theatre history but they remain important for their early support of diverse voices even as albee s career was skyrocketing he and his producers had begun a producing project that sowed the seeds of diversity equity and inclusion in a decidedly anti racist decolonizing and progressive move that still resonates powerfully today while this book is not a hagiography and does not intend to paint albee as without his own critical failings in terms of diversity in his own work and that of others this volume of theatre history dramatic literature and performance essays takes a detailed critical approach to albee s engagement with other initiating plays productions producers theatre companies theatre artists and performances in the united states that pushed the dial toward difference and diversity in the late 1950s through the late 1970s beginning the formations of new theatres of identity across the united states this volume will be of great interest to students and scholars in theatre and performance studies

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
